David Brush as the Alternate Eastside Coordinator was approved to represent Wayne Wantland at this meeting.

Minutes Correction: The March 30, 1993 minutes should be corrected as follows; Under the paragraph headed Wash State Application drop the remainder of the paragraph after the sentence ending with the words Roanoke Comm Center in downtown Seattle.

Correct the paragraph beginning with the words John Talbot ammended the motion to read; WSDOT be required to install 3 channels within 3 years and 2 additional channels after 3 years but within 5 years. If additional Wash State Agencies are added to the WSDOT system 2 additional interoperability channels will be required to be added to the system. Correspondence from Alan Hull dated April 19, 1993 confirms his understanding of this requirement.

Old Business: Lorilee reported that Sgt Gerry Sherman of the Prosser Police Dept has been recommended to be the primary Zone 5 representative to sit on the RRC Committee. Gerry's telephone number is 509-786-1500, Fax number 509-786-2292.

There has been no response to Kevin's request for participation in the RRC from Zone 1.

There has been no alternate Westside frequency coordinator as yet.

Bob Wentworth reported Terry Miller of WSDOT was recommended by Zone 6 to be their alternate representative. The group discussed the fact that Terry is a state employee and the state is already represented on the RRC by a representative. Bob withdrew Terry's name for consideration.

Kevin reported that a letter had been written to the Idaho NPSPAC representative our concerns about the frequency assignments in their plan which have a potential to interfere with frequency assignments in the Wash State Region 43 Plan.

David Brush submitted a draft of the revisions to the Region 43 plan prepared by Wayne Wantland. There was considerable discussion concerning the possible inclusion of the 70 slow growth 800 MHz channels to the plan.

Kevin reported that he is considering appointing a 3 or 4 member committee to recommend the allocation of the remaining 70 slow growth 800 MHz channels in the plan.

It was suggested that language be included that states there is no need to license mobile and portable radios used on the interoperability channels. It was also suggested that policies be developed concerning the requirement for licensees to install the interoperability channels in the mobile and portable radios. It was noted that in some NPSPACC plans names have been given the interoperability channels to avoid confusion.

It was also stated that our plan should indicate what channels are secondary to Canada.

New Business: City of Seattle application has been submitted for review by the committee.

Jay Morrison was added to the Technical Committee and Bob Wentworth agreed to be acting chair to consider the Seattle application in place of Jon Wiswell who is a city of Seattle employee.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 16:20 PM.
